

<b>Producer Guidance: Foreign Animal Disease Response on a Positive Farm</b>	
<b>DETECT</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Unusual signs/symptoms or death loss result in a report to herd vet or state/federal animal health official</li> <li>• FAD investigation initiated – See Producer Guidance: FAD Investigation Steps</li> </ul>
<b>QUARANTINE</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A case manager is assigned to your farm as the main contact for questions/assistance with required paperwork</li> <li>• Farm will be quarantined; restrictions for movement of animals/animal products and equipment as well as personnel on/off farm</li> <li>• Strict biosecurity and cleaning/disinfection guidelines will be implemented</li> </ul>
<b>APPRAISE</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Herd plan created and approved. Producer should have species number, age, and other details available.</li> <li>• USDA may provide indemnity for livestock that must be depopulated</li> </ul>
<b>INDEMNIFY</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Herd plan must be approved prior to depopulation</li> <li>• Initial indemnity payment received. Producer will receive a standard amount for clean-up activities (virus elimination)</li> <li>• SAMS number required to receive federal indemnity</li> </ul>
<b>DEPOPULATE</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Infected herds are depopulated as quickly as possible, ideally 24 hours from detection</li> <li>• Depopulation methods will be approved by the state/federal animal health official through the herd plan and must comply with AVMA Guidelines for Depopulation</li> </ul>
<b>CARCASS DISPOSAL</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• State/federal government will assist/advise on the safe disposal of livestock carcasses</li> <li>• Herd plan must include an approved disposal method</li> <li>• Will follow guidance/options listed in the IL Mass Animal Mortality Plan; may include composting, burial, above ground burial, incineration, landfill, and/or rendering</li> <li>• Disposal methods are site specific and depend on multiple factors (farm/livestock type, disease, soil type, state/federal and local laws)</li> </ul>
<b>VIRUS ELIMINATION</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cleaning and disinfection (C&amp;D) are performed on your farm to eliminate the virus in barns and other affected areas, including equipment</li> <li>• C&amp;D may be performed by yourself or hired contractors</li> </ul>
<b>TEST</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Once C&amp;D is completed you will notify your case manager</li> <li>• After required dwell period, environmental testing will be conducted to ensure the virus has been eliminated</li> </ul>
<b>RESTOCK</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Once approved by state/federal animal health officials, you may restock and resume production</li> <li>• The State Veterinarian will release your farm’s quarantine after testing requirements and waiting periods are completed</li> </ul>
<b>MAINTAIN BIOSECURITY</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• After restocking and returning to production, you will be expected to maintain the highest biosecurity standards to ensure your farm remains free of the virus</li> </ul>
