





Swine

- All breeds: Yorkshire (Large White), Landrace, Duroc, Hampshire, Berkshire, Pietrains and other exotic breeds, which possess the most desirable carcass and production traits sought by breeders and producers the world over.
- The U.S. is one of the world's leading pork-producing and exporting countries and Illinois is the 4th largest pork producing state.
- Everything from pure great grandparent stock to crossbreds in both boars and gilts, as well as fresh and frozen semen.

Beef

Illinois Offers:

- Since beef is so prevalent in Illinois, beef herds stretch statewide, rep resenting all the major breeds: Angus (Black and Red), Beefmaster, Brangus, Charolais, Hereford, Limousin, Santa Gertrudis, Senepol and Simmental.
- Good genetics are essential to operation profitability and Illinois has large selections of breeding bulls, stock cows, and heifers both registered and commercial, while selection can be done using expected progeny differences (EPDs).
- The Illinois beef breeds can provide gentle disposition, tender beef, car cass quality, strong hybrid vigor, ma ternal and paternal traits, efficiency, calving ease, polled, disease and insect resistance.

 Illinois' high-quality beef cattle genetics have been developed to fit climates that range from tropical to arctic.
