Illinois is an Agricultural State with 80% of the land being used for agriculture; 28.66 million acres.

The food and the agricultural industries are vital for the State's economy. Illinois ranks highest in processed food sales in the United States. We also rank first and second in soybean and corn production respectively. Illinois is the fourth most swine producing state in the US.



With the high grade improvements that have been made in Illinois' fields, 40 different kinds of crops are produced. The majority of which are dedicated for feed, different types of grains, as well as very high quality soybeans. Also, in Illinois a great variety of food is cultivated such as, seeds, fruits, and vegetables. The cattle production, specially the swine and the cattle that are raised with grains, is one of the most important income sources for the farmers in Illinois.

Illinois has the fortune of having some of the richest natural resources of the nation. The fertile land, the climate, good transportation, and its central location in the country; make Illinois ideal in accessing all of the markets in the country. Chicago is known across the globe because it is a great financial center, for its transportation system, and for its great diversity of people.



There are approximately 26,000 companies in Chicago alone dedicated to food processing and approximately 1,400 of them have their own processing and packing locations. There is great agricultural efficiency and productivity.
