

Illinois Bicentennial Farms Program

The Bicentennial Farm Program was established to honor the generations of farmers who have worked to maintain family farms in Illinois. Each Bicentennial Farm designee is a link to America's heritage and a reminder that the family farm remains a viable entity in today's agriculture.

The Illinois Department of Agriculture administers the Bicentennial Farms Program. This program inception in 2016 through the 99th Illinois General Assembly.

To qualify as a Bicentennial Farm, an agricultural property must have been owned by a straight or collateral line of descendants of the original owner for at least 200 years. Applicants must complete the application and verification forms found on the following pages. These forms request information regarding the present owner and location of the farm, a listing of ancestral owners and third-party verification of records proving lineal or collateral descent. A recognized title searcher, such as an abstractor, an attorney or a recorder of deeds, can verify lineal descent.

While completion of the application and verification forms are mandatory, completion of the original owner information sheet found on the last page is optional.

Applicants meeting all requirements of the program are notified by mail. The owner receives an official Bicentennial Farm sign suitable for outdoor display and a certificate bearing signatures of the Governor of Illinois and the Director of the Illinois Department of Agriculture. All application materials and other papers of historical significance are placed on file at the Illinois Department of Agriculture.
